

PROPOSED AMEDMENTS TO LEAGUE RULES FOR SEASON 2011

The LMC propose the following amendments to league rules:

All proposed amendments are indicated in **RED**

(1) Rule 2.4(vi)

Amended to read: The Fixture Secretary will publish all League Fixtures to all clubs by a **date in October** each year via a proforma. Clubs will.....

(2) Rule 2.5(i)

Amended to read: A cancellation due to adverse playing conditions may be made by the home club, **ONLY WITH THE AGREEMENT OF THE AWAY CLUB (E mail and Text messages should not be used)**. It shall be the responsibility of the home club to inform the appointed umpires of any cancellation.

(3) Rule 3.3 Hours of Play – General Information

(i)

Amended to read:

Matches shall commence at 1.30pm from April to the end of July (*1pm- Championship*), at 1pm in August and September (*12.30pm – Championship*). Clubs may if they so desire, start earlier if they mutually agree, the umpires Appointments Secretary, must be informed of the earlier start. **FAILED**

(iii)

Amended to read:

Matches in the Championship shall be of 50 scheduled overs per innings

Matches in Divisions 1 to 5 inclusive shall be of 46 scheduled overs per innings **FAILED**

Matches in Divisions 6 to 8 inclusive shall be of 40 scheduled overs per innings

The following time limits shall be allowed for each side to bowl their respective overs:

Championship: 3 hours

Div's 1 to 5 inclusive 2 hours 45 minutes

FAILED

Div's 6 to 8 inclusive 2 hours 25 minutes

(4) Rule 3.5 Matches Delayed at the Start or Interrupted by Weather, Light or Unforeseen Circumstances (Unforeseen Circumstances does not include injury) PASSED

(i)

Amended to read:

In the event of interference.....Both Captains will be informed of the deduction.

Where no play has commenced, no match shall start later than 3 hours after the scheduled start time.

PASSED

(5) Rule 7.4 DISCIPLINE

2. Procedure

2.1

Amended to read:

Any alleged breach of Paragraph 1, may be dealt with by the umpires in one of three ways:

(a)

The breach is deemed of a minor nature by the umpire(s):

Verbal advice/caution to the player and captain (No written report required)

(b)

The breach is more serious, but does not warrant an immediate Disciplinary Hearing in the view of the umpire(s):

Notification in writing (complaint) on an Accumulated Offence Form (AOF) to the Secretary of the League within a time limit of 7 days from the date of the alleged incident and copied to the Secretary of the BDUA. Both the player and captain should be informed.

The receipt of three (AOF's) against the same player in the same season will result in a ban from all cricket of 3 weeks. (A week is Saturday to Friday inclusive)

(c)

The breach is serious and warrants a Disciplinary Hearing in the view of the umpire(s)

Notification in writing (complaint) on a Disciplinary Offence Report Form to the Secretary of the League within a time limit of 7 days from the date of the alleged incident and copied to the Secretary of the BDUA. Both the player and captain should be informed.

2.2

Amended to read: Any complaint so initiated at (c) above must be referred to the Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee, who will consider the complaint as soon as practicable and decide upon whether a Disciplinary Hearing shall be convened.

2. Amended to read: Actions likely to receive at least a ban from all cricket of 2 weeks.....

3. Amended to read: Actions likely to receive at least a ban from all cricket of 4 weeks.....

4. Amended to read: Actions likely to receive at least a ban from all cricket of 8 weeks.....

2 / 3 / 4 – (A week is Saturday to Friday inclusive)

PASSED

5.

New rule to read:

Any club, where players have been found guilty of disciplinary offences on two or more occasions in the same season, will be fined a sum not exceeding £50 by the LMC.

In addition, if on those two or more occasions, the offences have been committed by members of the same team of that club, then that team will incur a deduction of 20 points at the start of the following season.

5. Appeals procedure

5.1

Amended to read: A player or club shall have the right of

appeal.....together with a deposit of £50 **PASSED**

(6) Harry Tomlins Knock-Out Competition

Rule 5(i)

Amended to read: **All matches shall be played on the appointed date, as arranged by the League Management Committee. PASSED**

Rule 5(iii)

In the event of a result still not having been reached, **the winner of the match shall be decided upon the toss of a coin. PASSED**
